

















































The Sparshites of grades V-VIII celebrated the 'Bastille Day', the common name given in English-speaking countries to the French National day, with great magnificence.


















### **EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING**





































atmosphere with the feeling of unity. The atrium of the school filled with colours of saffron, white and green colours which was flowing all around.

Science is a process of learning and discovering new horizons. We, at Sparsh Global School, Greater Noida West, provide a chance for our students to explore these aspects through different science activities. This enables the students to get a better understanding of science and makes learning more fun and interactive. In this activity, students of grade 5 were challenged to design and build a water filtration device using commonly available materials. Purification of water is a process that makes dirty water potable and fit for drinking. Through this concept, the students were introduced to different procedures that are used for water purification.

Children researched and used their understanding to create their own water purifiers, which they presented in class to create awareness about impurities and how they can collect rain water and purify it to use for different purposes.

The goal of experience-based learning is to help students identify their developmental needs and learn something important or meaningful to help them grow.

In grade 2, today the learners explored the concepts of elasticity and flexibility through simple and engaging experiments using everyday objects. These experiments helped young learners gras these scientific concepts in a hands-on manner.

Our learners blew up balloons and observed how they stretch and return to their original shape. This demonstrates elasticity as the balloon can stretch when inflated and then return to its original size. Another experiment involved hair bands. By stretching and releasing hair bands, students saw how they stretch to accommodate different sizes and shapes, showcasing their elasticity. Students gently bent the ruler and noticed how it flexes without breaking. This demonstrates flexibility, as the ruler can bend without snapping.

Lastly, tin rulers were used to teach the concept of elasticity as we These hands-on experiments not only made learning fun for our young learners but also laid the foundation for their understanding of elasticity and flexibility in the world around them.











Our young explorers in Grade 2 recently delved into the enchanting world of science with a fascinating experiment: The Walking Water Experiment!























Experiential learning is the need of the hour for our young learners. The activities related to the concept of "Money" was tailored for grade 2 students to introduce them to the world of local currency i.e "rupees" and basic mathematical operations related to money. Through interactive exercises and hands-on experiences, students were given the opportunity to develop foundational skills in coin and note recognition, counting, and basic addition. The main objective of these activities was to familiarize students with different coins and notes, their values, and to instil basic math skills necessary for handling money in everyday situations.

Students were presented with a variety of coins and notes for an activity. They learned to recognize and differentiate between these coins and notes by their appearance, size, and value. Students were provided with sets of coins and were asked to count the total value of each set and make money combinations of different values given by the teachers. This activity aimed to reinforce counting skills and improve their familiarity with the Indian currency, value for each coin and note. Students also did role play activity in pairs of a customer and a shopkeeper in a simulated store. They practiced making change, thereby strengthening their understanding of subtraction in a real-world context. These activities not only fosters mathematical growth but also instills a sense of confidence and competence in handling money, preparing them for real world financial responsibilities.

































To make our little Sparshites grasp the essence of facts and how they can utilize them in creating their own learning, a zoo activity was conducted for the students of grade 1. The activity aimed at making our kids understand that a whole world of facts exists outside the world of words, which, if used wisely, can serve as a gateway to new concepts and discoveries.

Students created exquisite animal models and delved into extensive research about their chosen animal, including details about their habitat, physical features, behavioral patterns, etc. The culmination of their efforts was evident as they confidently presented the information they had gathered. It was heartwarming to witness each child contributing in their own special way, creating a visually stunning and informative zoo.
